

Reading Behaviors and Understandings to guide comments/goals in F and P

Within the Text	<p>Acquire understanding of new words through reading</p> <p>Recognize and use simple punctuation, reflecting it in the voice while reading</p> <p>Recognize and actively work to solve new vocabulary words</p> <p>Reading with fluency</p> <p>Reflect meaning with the voice through pause, stress and phrasing</p> <p>Notice and ask questions when meaning is lost or understanding is interrupted</p> <p>Notice and use information from pictures</p> <p>Talk about characters, problems and events in story (in sequence)</p> <p>Include appropriate and important details when summarizing texts</p> <p>Summaries reflect understanding of graphic features (labels, headings,</p> <p>Follow multiple events in a story to understand the plot</p> <p>Include details that show a character's traits</p> <p>Revisit text for ideas or to check details</p> <p>Reflect both prior knowledge and evidence from the text in responses</p> <p>Seeking out and taking in the important information from the text and putting it together (searching).</p> <p>Checking understanding of what is read making sure it makes sense, sounds right and looks right.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Solve Words Use a range of strategies to read and understand words</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Monitor and Correct Check on accuracy and understanding and work to self-correct errors.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Maintain Fluency Read at a good rate, with phrasing, pausing, intonation and appropriate stress.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Adjust Take action in flexible ways to solve problems or fit purpose and genre. Speed up/slow down depending on purpose/difficulty of text.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Questioning Generating questions before, during and after reading.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Search for and Use Information Notice and use information sources (meaning, language structure, visual information)</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Determining Importance Deciding what is key or important information at the word, sentence or text level when reading.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Summarize Remember important information and carry it forward - condensing</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Visualize</p>
Beyond the text	<p>Making predictions as to what will happen next in the story, using evidence/information from text</p> <p>Express personal connections through discussion</p> <p>Connections between texts they have read/heard (by topic, major ideas, authors' styles and genres)</p> <p>Use background knowledge and experience to contribute to text interpretation</p> <p>Use details from illustrations/text to support points</p> <p>Infer a character's feelings or motivations</p> <p>Think about and interpret the significance of events in a story</p> <p>Bring background knowledge to understanding characters and their problems</p> <p>Provide evidence from the text or from personal experience to support written statements about a text.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Predict (what may happen next)</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Make Connections Personal/World/Text</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Synthesize (adjust present understandings to accommodate new knowledge - integrating new ideas with existing personal thoughts/knowledge)</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Visualize Creating mental images before, during, and after reading</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Infer (Think about what the writer means but has not stated)</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Questioning</p>
About the Text	<p>Recognize and identify parts of stories, such as beginning, series of events and endings</p> <p>Understand and discuss title, author, illustrator</p> <p>Express opinions about the appropriateness of the ending</p> <p>Notice how writer has used language or words to make text interesting</p> <p>Recognize when texts are realistic, fantasy, true informational, etc.</p> <p>Notice how layout of pictures/print affects the way you read it</p> <p>Check information in the text against their own experience</p> <p>Notice similarities and differences among texts that are by the same author or same topic</p> <p>Discuss characteristics of the work of some authors and illustrators</p> <p>Show awareness of sequence, compare and contrast, cause and effect and problem-solution.</p> <p>Notice the moral/lesson of a text</p> <p>Discuss opinions about a text and back them up with specific information/reasons</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Evaluating/Critiquing (think critically about the text) Reflecting and making judgements about the text during and after reading</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Analyze (Notice aspects of the writer's craft and text structure) Examining elements of texts to better understand their organization, features, and characteristics before, during and after reading.</p>
